Time Change

A study, published in 2014 in the journal Open Heart, found a 24 percent increase in heart attacks on the Monday after losing an hour of sleep in the spring. Many people don't get enough sleep in general, and losing an hour due to the spring time change compounds the problem, said Dr. Nilay Mehta, a cardiologist at Memorial Hermann

Today In History

March 10th

1302: Pope Boniface VIII sentences Italian poet and politician Dante Alighieri, author of the Divine Comedy, to be burned to death for political reasons.

1528: Balthasar Hubmaier, called by his enemies "head and most important of the Anabaptists," is burned at the stake in Vienna after being deemed a heretic by a Roman Catholic court. In addition to his writings against Lutherans and Zwinglians,

1681: Charles II makes English Quaker William Penn sole proprietor of the colonial American territory known today as the state of Pennsylvania.

1748: John Newton, the captain of a slave ship, converts to Christianity during a huge storm at sea.

1880: Commissioner George S. Railton and seven women arrive in New York City to establish the Salvation Army in the United States.

1898: George Mueller, English philanthropist and evangelist, dies. 1913: Harriet Tubman, known as "Grandma Moses" for her work rescuing slaves and guiding them to the north on what was dubbed "the Underground Railroad," dies.

1963: Some 25,000 people lined the 4-mile route to Shenandoah Memorial Park where singer Patsy Cline was buried at Winchester, Virginia.

1969: James Earl Ray pleaded guilty in Memphis, Tennessee, to the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

1980: Willard Scott debuted as the new weatherman on NBC-TV's "Today Show." He also played Mr. Poole occasionally on The Hogan Family.

1991: Easy rider Peter Fonda led 5,000 motorcyclists through Daytona Beach, Florida, to celebrate Bike Week.

1991: A Vincent van Gogh painting, "Still Life with Flowers," sold for \$1.43-million in Chicago.

1996: The International Museum of Cartoon Art opened in Boca Raton, Florida, housing 160-thousand cartoons by more than 1,000 artists. Peanuts creator Charles Schulz, who donated a million dollars to the museum, was on hand for the dedication.

1998: Federal authorities announced that in the two-year period 2004: Teenage sniper Lee Boyd Malvo was sentenced in Virginia to life in prison.

March 11th

843: Eastern churches officially reintroduced and sanctioned icons, after an 89-year controversy that occasionally turned violent.

1302: Romeo Monteveccio married Juliet Cappelleto in Citadela, Italy, and inspired Shakespeare to write a play about them. 1513: Leo X is elected pope. His eight-year tenure, marked by gross excesses and immorality

1812: Fire engulfs missionary William Carey's print shop in Serampore, India, destroying his massive polyglot dictionary, two grammar books, sets of type for 14 eastern languages, and whole versions of the Bible.

1870: The Martyrs Memorial, Smithfield, England is inaugurated. Many Christians had been executed at Smithfield over the years.

1888: Samuel Zwemer, who would become the Apostle to Islam, preaches his first public sermon — to an African -American congregation.

1897: Death of Henry Drummond noted for his popular Christian writings including a wonderful devotional, The Greatest Thing in the World.

1903: Lawrence Welk was born in Strasburg, North Dakota.

1930: The Intimate Revue closed at London's Duchess Theatre after half a performance, history's shortest theatrical run.

1945: Golfer Byron Nelson won the Miami Four-Ball Tourney, the first of 11 consecutive tournament victories on the pro golf tour. 1951: The comic strip "Dennis the Menace" first appeared in U.S. newspapers.

1958: A B-47 accidentally dropped an unarmed nuclear weapon into the garden of a family in Mars Bluff, South Carolina.

1986: NFL owners voted to use instant replays for the 1986 football season. The practice was discontinued in 1991, then brought back in 2000.

1998: The International Astronomical Union reported that a mile-wide asteroid could collide with Earth on October 26, 2028. The following day NASA said there was no chance of the asteroid hitting earth.

2002: England's Plymouth University became the first school in the world to offer a degree in surfing.

March 12th

- 417: Pope Innocent I died. His claims for the Roman see's supremacy went farther than any of his predecessors, as he asserted Rome's reach extended to the whole church.
- 604: Gregory the Great, pope from 590 to 604, dies.
- 1088: Odo of Lagery is elected pope and takes the name Urban II.
- 1621: The Pilgrims, having arrived in New England four months earlier, finally leave the ship Mayflower to live ashore.
- 1685: Anglican bishop and philosopher George Berkeley is born in Ireland.
- 1875: John McCloskey is named the first US Cardinal.
- 1942: After first asking him to take a pay cut, the New York Yankees agreed to give Joe DiMaggio a \$6,250 raise.
- 1951: "Dennis the Menace," a comic by cartoonist Hank Ketcham, made its syndicated debut in 16 newspapers.
- 1974: "Wonder Woman" premiered on television, starring Lynda Carter.
- 1986: History's fattest cat died at age 10 in Cairns, Australia. The neutered male house cat named Himmy was 38 inches long and weighed 47 pounds.
- 1990: 153,000 snails were reported missing from a snail farm in Hebburn, England, apparently history's largest snail disappearance.
- 1994: The Church of England ordained its first women priests.

March 13th

- 1456: Johann Gutenberg first publishes the Bible on his printing press with movable type.
- 1569: Roman Catholics defeat the Huguenots at Jarnac, France. Condé, the Huguenot leader, is killed.
- 1815: Presbyterian medical missionary James Hepburn is born in Milton, Pennsylvania.
- 1884: Standard time was adopted in the United States. 1892: Charles Henry Packhurst preaches his famous documented sermon against Tammany Hall corruption in New York, helping to bring about reform in that city.
- 1925: Austin Peay, governor of Tennessee, signs the "Butler Bill," prohibiting any teaching that contradicted the Genesis creation story.
- 1925: Tennessee prohibits the teaching of evolution in public schools. This ban led to the Scopes Monkey trial in which William Jennings Bryan prosecuted Scopes (who was found guilty of violating the law). Court rulings have not allowed prohibitions like Tennessee's to stand.
- 1983: The Larry King Live show premiered on CNN.
- 1988: Gallaudet University, a liberal arts college for the hearing-impaired since 1864 in Washington, D.C., chose I. King Jordan to become the school's first deaf president.
- 1996: The Nigerian news agency reported that a woman waiting in line three hours for gasoline gave birth to a baby girl.
- 1997: A lock of British naval hero Lord Nelson's hair sold at auction for \$8,096.
- 2002: President Bush declared Iraqi President Saddam Hussein was a menace and had to be dealt with, and Osama bin Laden had been reduced to a marginal figure in the war on terrorism.
- 2006: U.S. Customs agents in California found 250 bogus billion dollar bills while investigating a man charged with currency smuggling.

41 More Texas Churches Leave United Methodist Church amid Schism over Homosexuality Another 41 congregations in Texas have officially left The United Methodist Church in response to the mainline Protestant denomination's ongoing debate over its stance on homosexuality. Christian Charity Sues Washington State for Right to Hire Only People Who Follow Biblical Beliefs A Christian homeless shelter filed a federal lawsuit against Washington state officials alleging that its First Amendment rights to hire "like minded" individuals who share their biblical mission about only hiring those who practice sexual purity in marriage has been violated. From serving meals to providing shelter to those in need and medical and recovery resources, Yakima Union Gospel Mission aims to serve anyone with its Christian-based services. However, the organization only hires people who share and live out its religious beliefs. Specifically, the organization hires only those who support its biblical mission of "spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ through its homeless shelter, addiction-recovery programs, outreach efforts, meal services, and health clinics for the Yakima community." Federal Court Recognizes Pro-Life Pregnancy Care Network's Right Not to Hire Abortion Supporters A federal court determined that a network of New York-based pregnancy centers can proceed with challenging a law that the organization said forces pro-life or religious groups to hire employees who have had abortions or hold views contrary to their mission. The 2nd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New York City reversed a lower court's decision to dismiss a January 2020 civil suit brought by the Evergreen Association. Evergreen operates a network of pregnancy centers called the Expectant Mother Care (EMC Frontline). Circuit Judge Steven Menashi stated in the ruling that the group's beliefs about the "morality of abortion are its defining values" and that "forcing it to accept as members those who engage in or approve of that conduct would cause the group as it currently identifies itself to cease to exist."

orders list released Tuesday morning, the high court denied a petition to hear arguments in the case of City of
Ocala, Florida v. Art Rojas, which centers on a lawsuit against officials for holding a prayer vigil in Ocala in

2014. Justice Neil Gorsuch issued a statement of support for the denial of the petition that was included in the orders list, in which he argued that there was "no need for the Court's intervention at this juncture." Gorsuch referenced the Supreme Court decision in Kennedy v. Bremerton School District, in which the high court ruled 6-3 that a public school district was wrong to punish a football coach for his practice of praying on the field after the end of games.

Arkansas Passes Universal School Choice Program, Bans Teaching of Sexuality before 5th Grade Arkansas Gov. Sarah Huckabee Sanders signed a sweeping education bill into law Wednesday, becoming the fifth state to enact a universal school choice program. The law also bans certain topics from being taught in public classrooms. The legislation, Senate Bill 294, also known as Arkansas LEARNS Act, passed the state Senate by a vote of 26-8 Tuesday. The bill includes a plan for the state to adopt a universal school choice program by the 2025-2026 school year. Students who have disabilities, are facing homelessness, attended a failing school in the previous school year, or have parents who are active duty military are eligible to receive vouchers for the 2023-2024 school year. The vouchers will be known as "Educational Freedom Accounts." In addition to promoting school choice, the bill includes a provision for the Department of Education to ensure communications and materials do not "indoctrinate" students with "ideologies," with the legislation specifically mentioning critical race theory.

Tuesday by the American Jewish Committee and religious scholars Asma Uddin and Steven Collis asked the
U.S. Supreme Court to rule in favor of Gerald Groff, who began working for the U.S. Postal Service in 2012 and
accused his former employer of refusing to provide reasonable accommodations for his religious practices. Groff
claimed that he was forced to resign from his job in 2019 because USPS would not "honor [his] personal
religious beliefs." After the U.S. 3rd Circuit Court of Appeals ruled against Groff last year, the Supreme Court will
hear the postal worker's case, Groff v. DeJoy, on April 18.

A private space tech firm will become the first entity to launch a 3D-printed rocket, which is technically the largest 3D-printed object as well. Totally reusable, the Terran 1 will launch today from the spaceport at Cape Canaveral at 1:00 PM US Eastern Time, and will be streamed live on this YouTube channel. Built by Relativity Space, the company has huge ambitions for lowering the cost and emissions of spacefaring. This real-world test of Terran 1 features a rocket made with only 85% printed material, but future rockets will reach 95% and will include additive-manufactured boosters as well.
